COUNCIL PASSES BY-LAW TO ORGANIZE FIRE DEPT.
 At a special meeting on Tuesday, Dec. 13th, the Reeve and Council of Terrace Bay passed By-Law 132, deadline with the organizing of a Municipal Fire Department.

The appointment of Bob Hoffland (Effective Jan. 1st) as acting Fire Chief, at a salary of \$4,800 per year plus car allowance, was ratified. Mr. Hoffland is presently employed as a full time fireman with Kimberly-Clark.

He will be responsible for fire protection and the care and maintenance of Township Fire Fighting equipment. George Maitland will continue as Mill Fire Chief and will also help out in maintaining town equipment.

The new Fire Chief will head a volunteer brigade of twelve public spirited citizens who have chosen Gordon Kydd as their team captain. The work dealing with the transfer was done under the direction of Joe Heenan, Committee Chairman.

Other items dealt with were (1) purchase of a Police car - the order being awarded to Terrace Bay Enterprises for a new Pontiac, and (2) answering a local request for restricting number of filling stations in Town, Council resolved that they have neither the desire nor authority to pass legislation which infringes on or in any way restricts trade. Council can only pass by-laws in this regard for zoning or traffic reasons.
