MARATHON'S NEW TALL OIL PLANT

As a further measure to fully utilize the potential value of the main raw material wood, a new phase of operation was recently started in the Marathon mill. The new process converts soap skimmings to crude tall oil.

The crude tall oil is shipped to a fractionation plant built by Hercules Powder Company at Burlington, Ontario.

In a detailed report in the Marathon Mercury last week it is noted that skimmings from Terrace Bay are shipped to Marathon for processing to crude tall oil.
