HIGH SCHOOL CHAIRMAN COMMENTS ON "RATING" Daily newspapers in Ontario recently published reports of ratings given by secondary school teachers on their employers.

The 'confidential' report, issued to members of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers Federation recently, was based on replies to a questionnaire from 90 percent of Ontario teachers.

The questions were sent out by the Federation executive last spring and asked teachers to give their opinions on the local school board's attitude towards educational improvements, relations between teachers and the board and conditions of work.
