Annual appointments and re-appointments to various duties were made and a by-law passed authorizing financial arrangements with the local bank.

The second Monday of each month was set as regular council meeting nights and starting time changed to 7 P.M.

A by-law re opening of lane behind the Roman Catholic Church was passed and accounts were ordered paid.
