

MORE ON ST. ANDREWS ANNUAL MEETING

Space last week did not permit publishing more of this lengthy report but on further study statistics in it show a remarkable variety of organizations within the Church and a striking number of individuals who are actively working in various capacities in these organizations.

There are 124 members in the Cradle Roll Department, 130 in the Sunday School, 29 in the Mission Band and 27 in C.G.I.T., 40 in the Junior Choir. Thirty-eight different names are mentioned in the report as holding various office or leading groups and several are in more than one activity. In addition it is mentioned that there are 12 Sunday School teachers and an unknown number serving on the two Church Boards. The Minister of the Church is Rev. R.A. Crook and, from the report, a large percentage of the members of his congregation are active workers in the Church.
