McCausland, in a recent report to the municipal Board of Health, stated that an enviable health record exists in Terrace Bay and reported on the immunization program carried out by the School Nurse, Mrs. Hopper and himself; examinations of school children; the regular inspection of public facilities and laboratory tests of water. Fifty-four birth to local residents and a total of 136 births were recorded in the Terrace Bay Private Hospital during 1960. There were two still births and two deaths during the year.
