Ruth Shirriff rolled High Game in the Ladies Ten Pin League, scoring 182. She also claimed High Three Games with her total of 469.

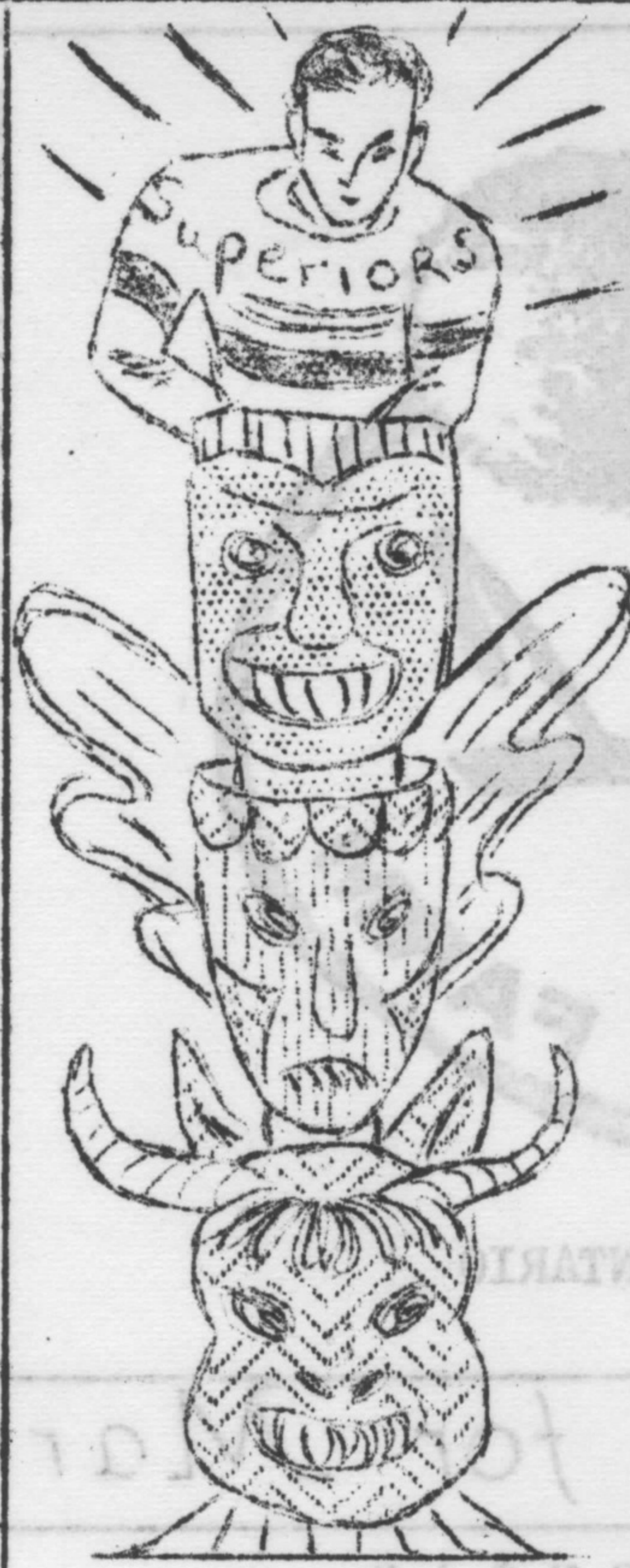
Some other nice games were rolled by V. Hanna 463 - J.Stachiw, 430 - L.Malashewski 420 and Bea Fawcett 415.

TERRACE BAY BANTAMS 7 MARATHON BANTAMS 0

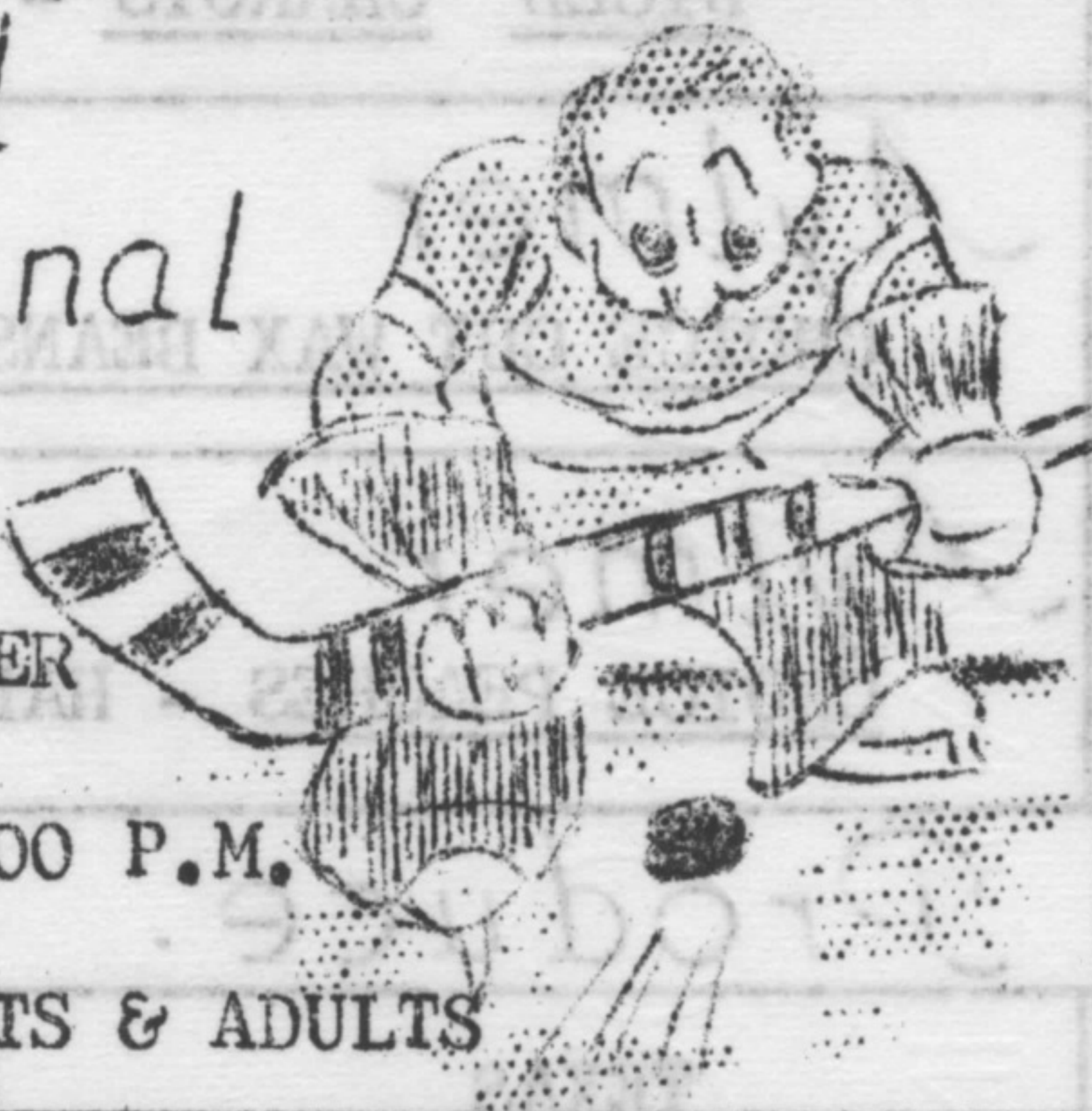
