MINOR HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIPS PLAYED HERE

Weekend play at the Terrace Bay Arena last Saturday and Sunday exhibited Minor Hockey at its best for the Thunder Bay Championships in the Bantam, Midget and Juvenile classes.

Stiff competition prevailed through the semi-finals and finals; the outcome proclaimed Port Arthur West End Bearcats victorious over Terrace Bay in the Bantam Division; Schreiber knocked out Fort William Canadiens for Midget Supremacy and, in a game played under protest, Fort William Canadiens walked off with a win over the Kenora Norman Strattons in the Juvenile Division.

Terrace Bay Bantams played off with Dryden for the right to meet Pt. Arthur. The boys rang up a neat 9 - 3 tally. Dryden started slow, not counting until the second period, found some spark in the third to get two more counters, Botey singling followed by Sfredo with Yoshida. Danny Schock was hat trick man for Terrace with Frank Schock, Pellegrino and Gresdale counting two each.

The tables were reversed for the finals with Port Arthur when they ended on the short side of a 6 - 2 count for Port Arthur Bearcats. Bearcats ran a 3-1-2 tattoo while only allowing two hits in the first to the Terrace Bay squad. Schock again was sharp shooter for the losers while Slanisky for Port Arthur got one in each period. Milani came close with an opener and in the third period tally Schilla singled.

Bones McCormack presented the C.W. Cox Trophy Championship.

Fort William were held scoreless for the first two periods but made a strong bid in the third with three counts by Margarit, Everett and Munson. Fedun and Stojco found the net for the first two period scores by Schreiber with Cellert and Gresdale shooting home in the third.

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council last Wednesday afternoon received a request through the Recreation Association for a grant for the Terrace Bay Band.

As one of Council's representatives on the Recreation Committee, Councillor Heenan itemized the request and its proposals. The educational and cultural benefits of the Band were discussed but, for a town under two thousand, the need for a grant and size of same would have to be investigated. To receive the layout more fully Reeve Ferrier suggested a meeting between Council and one member of the Band and two from the Recreation Committee on March 29th at 4:30 P.M. Councillors Duncan and Evans-Smith voiced approval of the meeting.

A further proposal by the Recreation Association Committee for a meeting was accepted and will be scheduled and will serve to define the present set up of the By-Law wherein Council still reserves the right to scrutinize all spending. March accounts for the Recreation Association were perused and accepted.

A complaint was registered by Council with the C.U.A. concerning notification of the regular fire inspection in Town. At the last inspection no notification was received and the persons responsible were therefore unable to accompany the inspectors and improve the knowledge and standards of their work. In reply the Underwriters assured Council there would be notification in the future.

A letter was sent to Mr. Nichle, Dept. of Ontario Planning and Development, together with map and scale plan, showing details of the proposed Trailer park in Terrace Bay. This Park would be in the hands of the Recreation Committee, under the Recreation Director who holds a Class "A" Certificate. Estimated cost of the Park was \$30,000, including voluntary labor through community spirited organizations. Mr. George Wardrope, M.P., who had received a copy, wrote assuring Council he would see the plan was presented to the Hon. Mr. Nichle. (Cont'd Page 7)
