

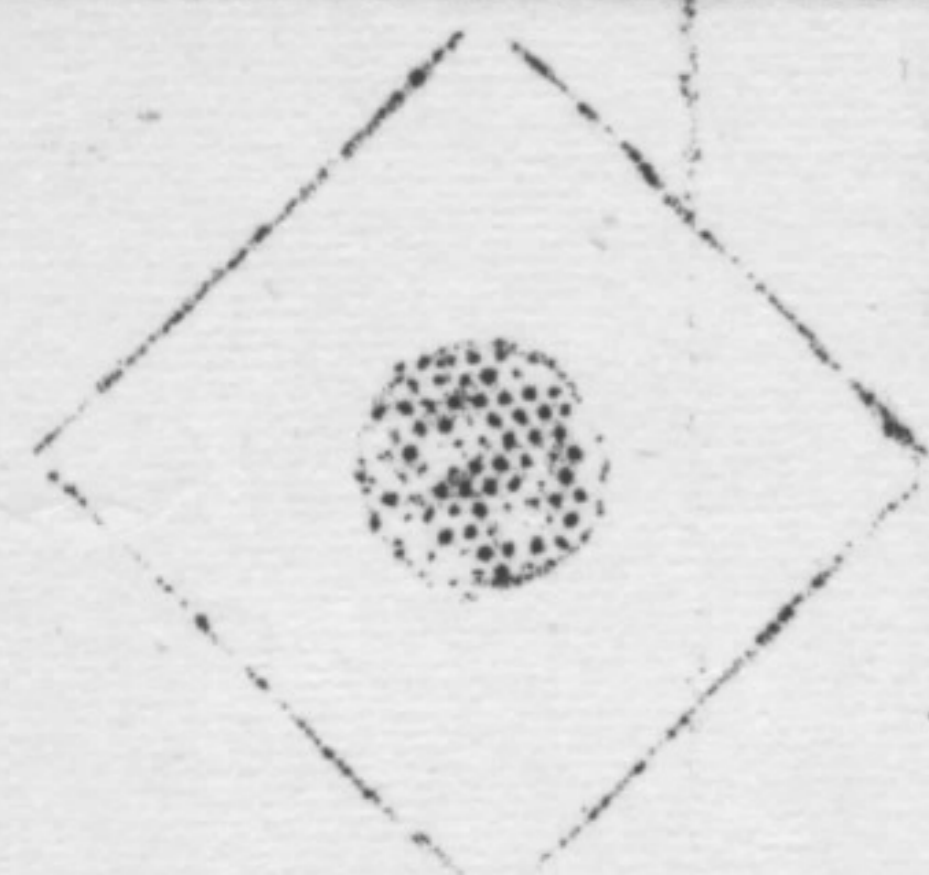

Safety - a family affair

Mom and Dad are you making safety a family affair? Well you can start now by encouraging and helping your sons and daughters to prepare for the big "Bicycle Safety Rodeo" to be held May 27th.

Remember, it is through your guidance and example that your children will become safety conscious citizens of our community.

BICYCLE SAFETY RODEO

Now is the time to start preparing your bike for the big Safety Rodeo. Besides giving your bike a fresh coat of paint here are a few of the things your bike will be checked for at the Safety Rodeo.

1. Correct size of bike - your feet should easily reach the pedals.
2. Seat tight and the correct height.
3. Handle bars tight and grips in good condition.
4. Frame straight and free from cracks.
5. A bell or horn as required.
6. Spokes tight - none missing.
7. Brakes dependable and fast acting.
8. Chain oiled, no weak links.
9. Wheel and sprocket bearings adjusted and lubricated.
10. Rear reflector in good condition.

Three ingredients for safety on our streets - Safety minded Pedestrian, Cyclist and Motorist.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Township Council has directed me to issue the following statement regarding the level of 'Good Housekeeping' in Terrace Bay.

1. There is an increasing amount of litter around the shopping area and in the section of the Town lying south of the Highway. The cost to keep this litter picked up at all times would be prohibitive. Litter at the shopping centre originates largely from failure to use the receptacles provided. Litter throughout the residential areas originates from failure of residents to properly secure dry garbage before setting it out for collection.
2. Some residents are storing equipment and material outside the bounds of their own lots. This is particularly noticeable in the "Green Belt" areas along either side of the Highway. This is Township property and is reserved to make an attractive appearance to the Town. All privately owned material is to be removed or further misuse of these areas will result in action by the Township on violators.

3. Old cars or trucks, will not under any circumstances be allowed to be stored outside the householder's property. Stripped or partially stripped cars or trucks will not be permitted to remain within a resident's yard beyond a reasonable length of time. They are to be removed to the scrap metal dump.

Council is confident all residents will respond to this request for annual Spring Cleaning and continued tidy habits.
