Cookie Day Convenor Mrs. S. Dorman reported a successful sale and Mrs. M. Hamilton gave her Camp report. The local Guide Camp will be held from June 29 till July 6 at the Boy Scout Camp at White Sand Lake. Mrs. Hamilton has contacted the Department of Lands and Forests for a suitable site for a permanent Girl Guide Camp. Mrs. Y. Boudreau volunteered assistance with the Fly Up on June 24th.

Mrs. Mikus requested volunteers to test Brownies on their table setting, and Mrs. Dorman offered assistance. It was felt the Badge Secretary Mrs. P. Anyone having tea towels or flour sacks, phone Mrs. Downey and they will be picked up. The Girl Guide Rally will be held in Manitouwadge this year on September 22 to 24.

There will be no meeting in June and the September meeting will be held at the home of Mrs. Hamilton. Mrs. Farrow served a lovely luncheon at the close of the meeting.
