"Everyone Help Prevent Forest Fires" The livelihood of practically everyone in Terrace Bay depends on the products of the forests which surround our community. Your local Fire Dept. makes this appeal on behalf of the Dept. of Lands and Forests in their Forests Fire Prevention Drive to make our forests greener and to help keep them for wild life protection.

Every individual in the community can help in forest fire prevention by strictly observing and encouraging others to observe the rules of fire safety. Here's a few brief rules to observe to help prevent a forest fire Smoking - Smoke only while stopped in a safe place, never while travelling in the woods or when on a portage when fishing. Matches - Be sure your match is out, break it in two before you throw it away, or use a .. lighter - it's safer. Tobacco - Be sure pipe ashes, cigars and cigarettes are out when you throw them away. Never throw them into bush, leaves or needles. Use roll-your-owns for safety. Making Camp - Build your fire in the clear away from trees, stumps and bush. Breaking Camp - Never break camp till your fire is out. Dead out. Then make sure there are no sparks left. Around your Summer Camp - Never burn brush without a Fire Burning Permit. Travelling - Travel only if you have a Travel
