Mrs. Whent gave the sick & visiting report and Financial Secretary's report was given by Mrs. H. Wallace.

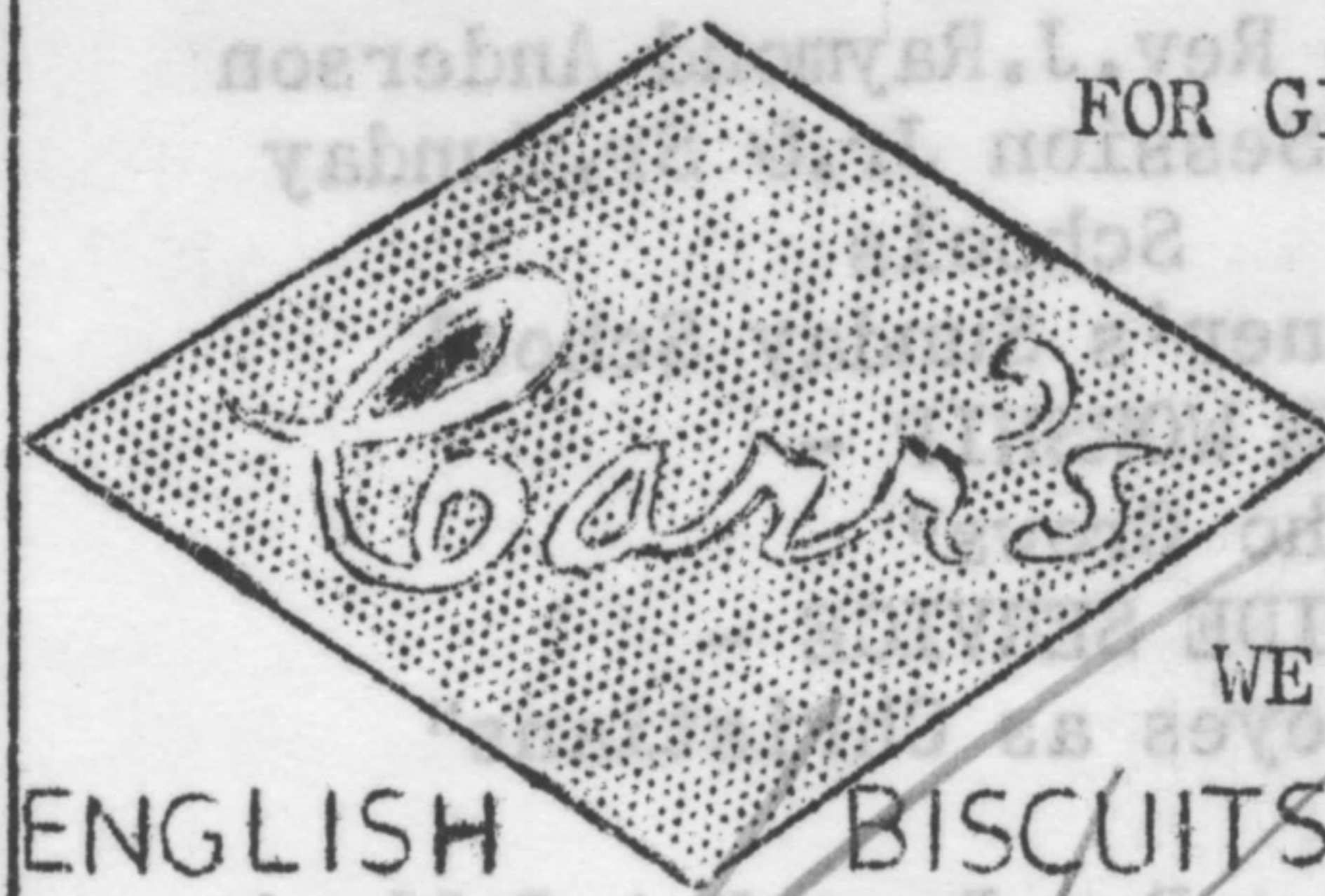
Mrs. Dorlene Pastor, bride-elect of June, was the recipient of a wedding gift and farewell gift from the Lodge members.
