COUNCIL QUOTES

Acting Reeve J. Heenan presided at last Wednesday's meeting of the Terrace Bay Council when Councillors J. Duncan, D. Evans-Smith, Sec. Treas. W. F. Strutt, Clerk W. Hanley and

a deputation of citizens headed by Elmer Persson were also present.

Minutes of the last meeting were adopted and correspondence read included a letter from V. Everitt, C.P.R. Supt. in Schreiber, regarding the closure of a private crossing.

In this connection Council was questioned by Mr. Persson who was advised that a heavy liability would fall upon the Town in the event of an accident at said crossing and that Council therefore deemed it advisable to close same.

A letter was read regarding insurance on Police car, also one from North Star Hotels regarding erection of an advertising sign. The solicitor had sent a ruling on the door to door sale of religious literature and correspondence with the Recreation Association was read. The Schreiber Dumping area was discussed and letters read and permission granted for storage of a trailer.

Correspondence from a possible purchaser of Bucovetsky's Store included a request for permission to make use of part of said premises for temporary living quarters. Approval was given for stipulated areas of the building.

The Police report submitted by Chief Billings showed an increase in vandalism etc. and cited 11 cases prosecuted under the Highway Traffic Act - total fines levied amounting to \$120.00 - and that five juveniles had been convicted of offences.

The Fire Dept. report included the recommendation that a resuscitator be purchased for the Fire Truck.
