YOUTH COUNSELLORS AND CLUB MEMBERS AT QUETICO

Adult counsellors and selected members of community youth clubs will meet at the Quetico Conference and Training Centre for a week-long residential course, August 25th to September 1st. Delegates will represent communities in Northwestern Ontario and Manitoba.

The purposes of the course are: a) to interpret the role and job of the Counsellor and the function of the executive members of youth organizations and b) to provide training in programme skills essential to the conduct of youth organization.

Dr. Michael F. Grapko, M.A., Ph.D., University of Toronto, Professor Psychology and Child Study, will act as chief resource leader for discussions on Education, Family relations, Current Affairs and boy-girl Relations.

The programme has been divided into two courses. Course 1, from August 25 - 27, will be a concentrated weekend course for adult counsellors of youth clubs.

For youth delegates accompanying to Course 1, a separate programme has been arranged. Course II is for youth club members AND Counsellors. A trophy will be awarded for the best press release of the Camp.

The course is open to people from community teen clubs, church groups, school or other community organizations in the ratio of one adult counsellor to two teenagers. Registration forms may be obtained from the Community Programmes Branch, 400 Catherine Street, Fort William, or from K.G. Ward, Recreation Director, Terrace Bay.

The course is sponsored by the Northwestern Zone of the Society of Directors of Municipal Recreation, The Community Programmes Branch of the Ontario Department of Education and the Quetico Conference and Training Centre.

DEPT. OF LANDS & FORESTS LISTS FUTURE PARKS

A recent release from the Department of Lands and Forests includes a list of some of the areas deemed suitable for future park purposes which are being set aside now...and "will give some indication of the continuing expansion and development projected for the provincial parks system."

In the Geraldton District (under whose jurisdiction our vicinity lies), four areas in Townships 88, 89, 91 near Nipigon and areas around Lukinto Lake and Neys, are the only ones earmarked for further development.

The hunting season for squirrel and rabbit runs from Sept. 30th to November 30th, 1961. The bag limit remains unchanged at ten per day.
