VOLUNTEER FIGHT FIRE NEAR TERRACE BAY!!!

Last week volunteer fire fighters from Terrace Bay were called upon to battle a bush fire just about a mile west of the Post Office! The blaze started on Wednesday and was first reported by Shift Workers and a Mill Watchman.

Although not the spectacular type of fire known as a "top" fire, this one quickly developed into the most stubborn type--a ground fire which takes a tenacious grip in moss pockets and "duff", burning in some places three feet deep.

In the attack volunteers were required to pack water up a very steep bluff and, to assure that there was no rapid spread during the night from high winds, a patrol or picket maintained an all-night vigil. The men were kept busy the whole time controlling spot fires.

On Thursday morning conditions were such that it was deemed advisable to fight the ground fire in the duff and stumps with water rather than man power so the Village Queen Pumper and Hose were set up beside the Highway and water was pumped approximately 150 Ft. up the bluff. Water was hauled to the Pumper by the Bush Fire Tanks

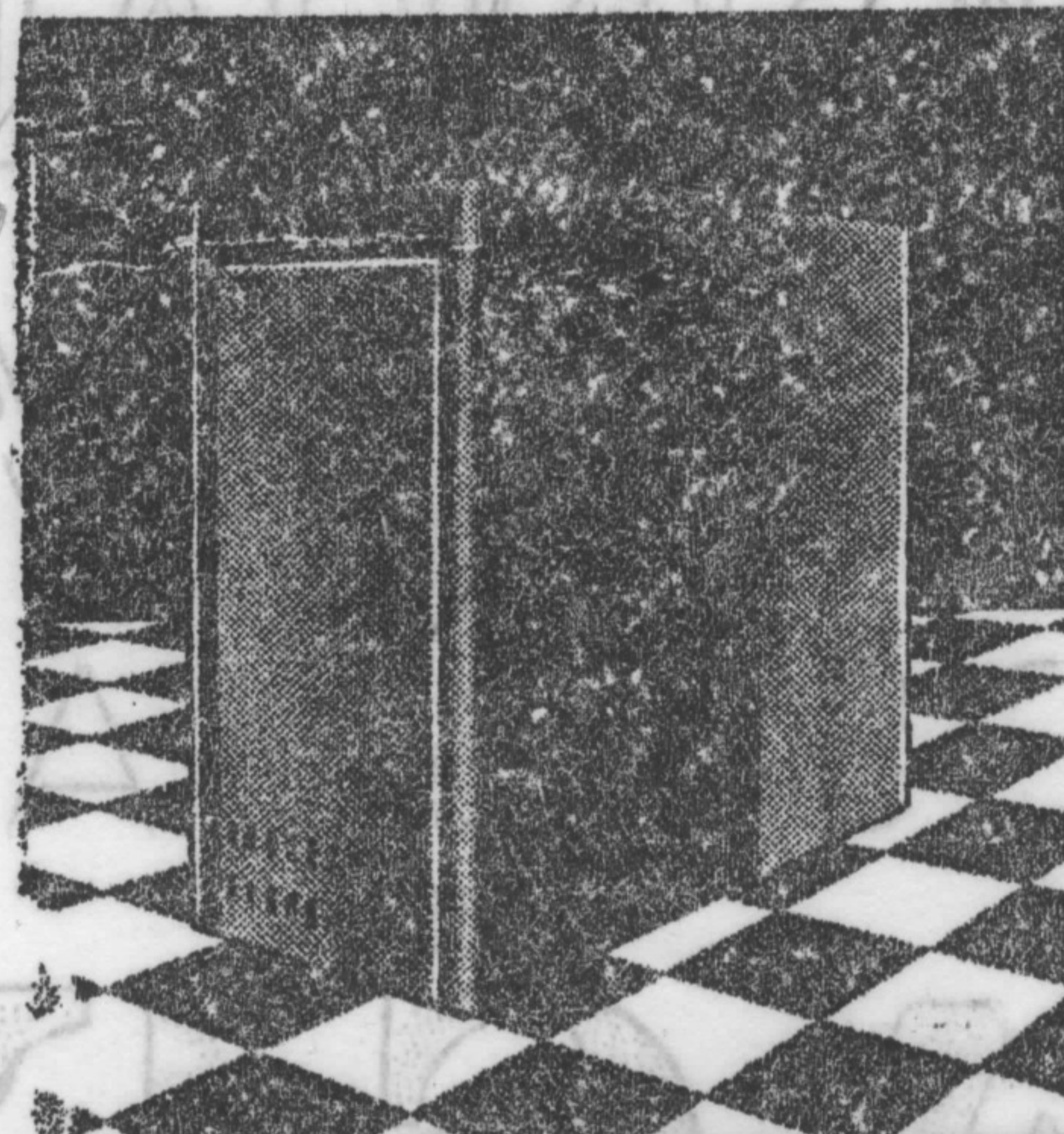

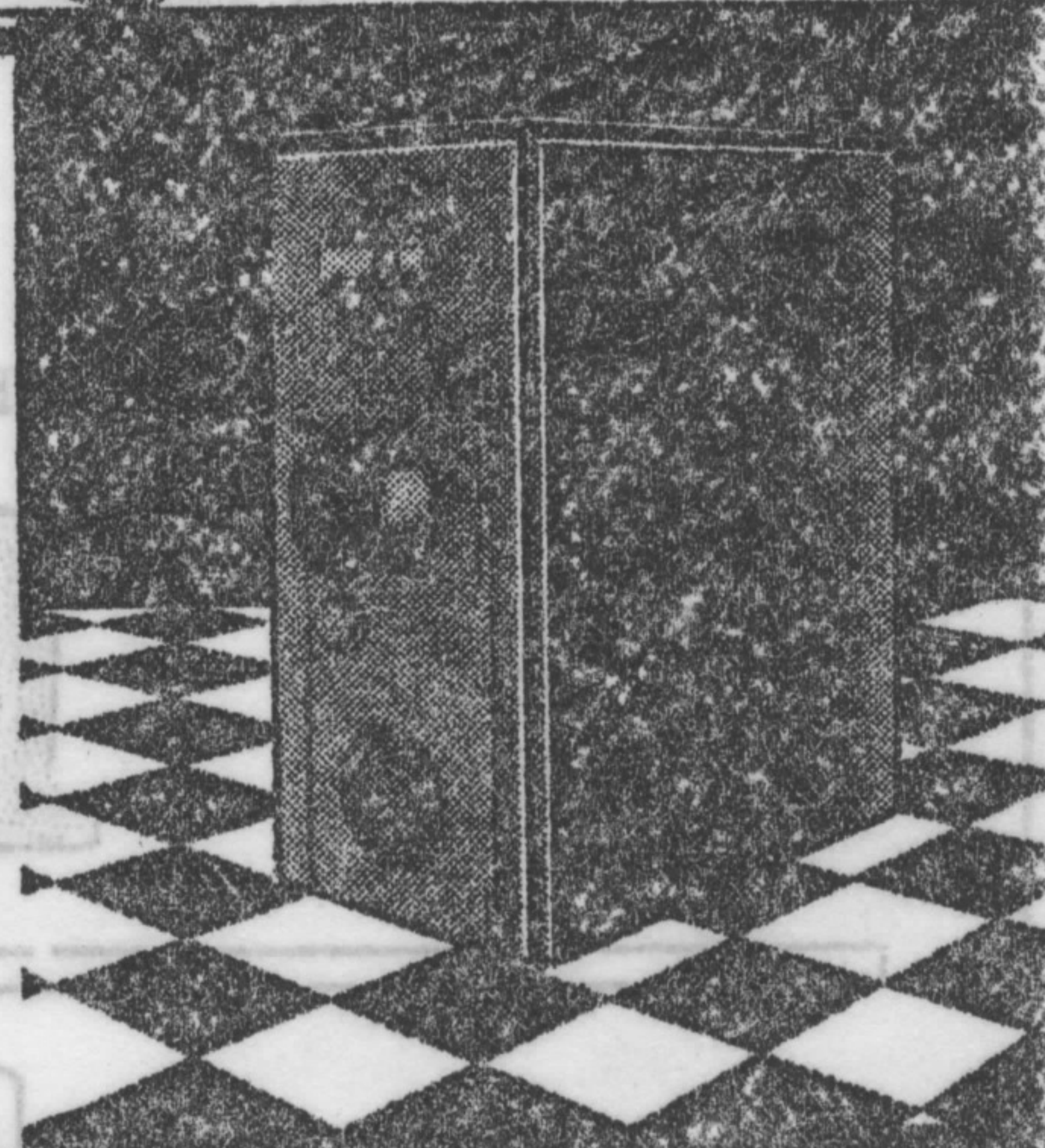
