

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Council met in the Municipal Offices on Thursday afternoon, presided over by the Reeve, Mr. John Ferrier and Secretary, Mr. W.F. Strutt and a full attendance of Councillors with Mr. Evans-Smith, Mr. Heenan, Mr. Gillis and Mr. Duncan present.

Minutes were accepted and correspondence included a letter from the Terrace Bay Commerce Committee with the following recommendations: that the Department of Highways be contacted with the request to have the mileage through Terrace Bay posted east of Nipigon: that the sign pointing to the business district when travelling east be moved so that it points up Simcoe Plaza and not up Selkirk Avenue. Council noted that this had already been attended to and also recommended a sign indicating "No through street" should be posted at Lakeview and Superior and a similar sign on the Railroad Station road to avoid further confusion with tourists attempting to turn large trailers in this small confine. They further recommended that the present Town sign be relocated from its present position near the overpass to just east of the Mill Road and west of the Department of Highways.

A letter from the Lake Superior International Highway Association with regards to the promotion on a publication of the Circle Route was referred to the Commerce Committee.

Correspondence between Council and the Ryder Paving Company was enlarged upon with the announcement that two streets, Princess and Elizabeth would be recapped during the week of August 28th. This recapping will be built up from cold mix (crushed gravel and bituminous oil), a method highly recommended to the Town.

The resignation of Mr. F.O. Soughton as Chairman of the Commerce Committee was accepted with regret and an appreciative letter sent to Mr. Soughton for organizing and chairing this Committee to date. Mr. Wm. Louk was duly appointed as a new member to the Commerce Committee.

Aerial photographs of Terrace Bay by the Department of Lands and Forests would be impossible until Spring as the helicopter is unavailable. The Department suggested the Beaver Aircraft from Pays Plat Division would do a satisfactory job, using a fixed wing photography and Council duly made this request of Mr. McGooley of Pays Plat.

An invitation to attend the Schreiber Hydro Electric Commission on September 14th and 15th was accepted by Reeve Ferrier and Councillors Duncan and Heenan.

A request was forwarded to Kimberly-Clark Corporation to purchase Lot No. 12 in the business section for the building of a Utilities Office and Shop. This was felt to be the most desirable lot.

Police Chief Mr. A. Billings report for the month of July noted a decline in minor complaints but an increase in major crimes with recent safe-cracking in the Town and break-ins of business establishments. Reeve Ferrier requested Mr. Duncan to arrange a meeting of the Police Committee.

Reeve Ferrier reported on the fine showing by the Bush Fire Control during last week's fire. Excellent radio communication had been maintained and a fine effort by all volunteer fire fighters. Pays Plat was in touch at all times and, on investigation, thoroughly

approved the work Building permits in the amount of \$16400 had been issued in Jly.

Mr. Evans-Smith requested information on the advancement of plans for a Municipal Park. In the event the present location under consideration doesn't materialize Mr. Evans-Smith suggested the small park at the River

Mouth could also be considered with a new road which would tie in with the proposed golf course and plan a bridge over the lower Falls.

Further to this subject Mr. Heenan stated considerable work would be required to fix up the swimming pool area at the dam for the next season, and the Recreation Committee wished to be advised if the old area should be repaired or if work would be commenced on the new swim area. Mr. Ferrier recommended a meeting with the Recreation Association. It was noted there was a run off of 165 gallons a minute at the new area.

Mr. Ferrier enquired as to the maintenance of the triangle in front of the Community Church. Mr. Duncan recommended a portion of this triangle should be cut down as it was somewhat of a traffic hazard.
