Cynthia Bond, Port Arthur was home for the weekend with her grandmother, Mrs. E. O'Connor.

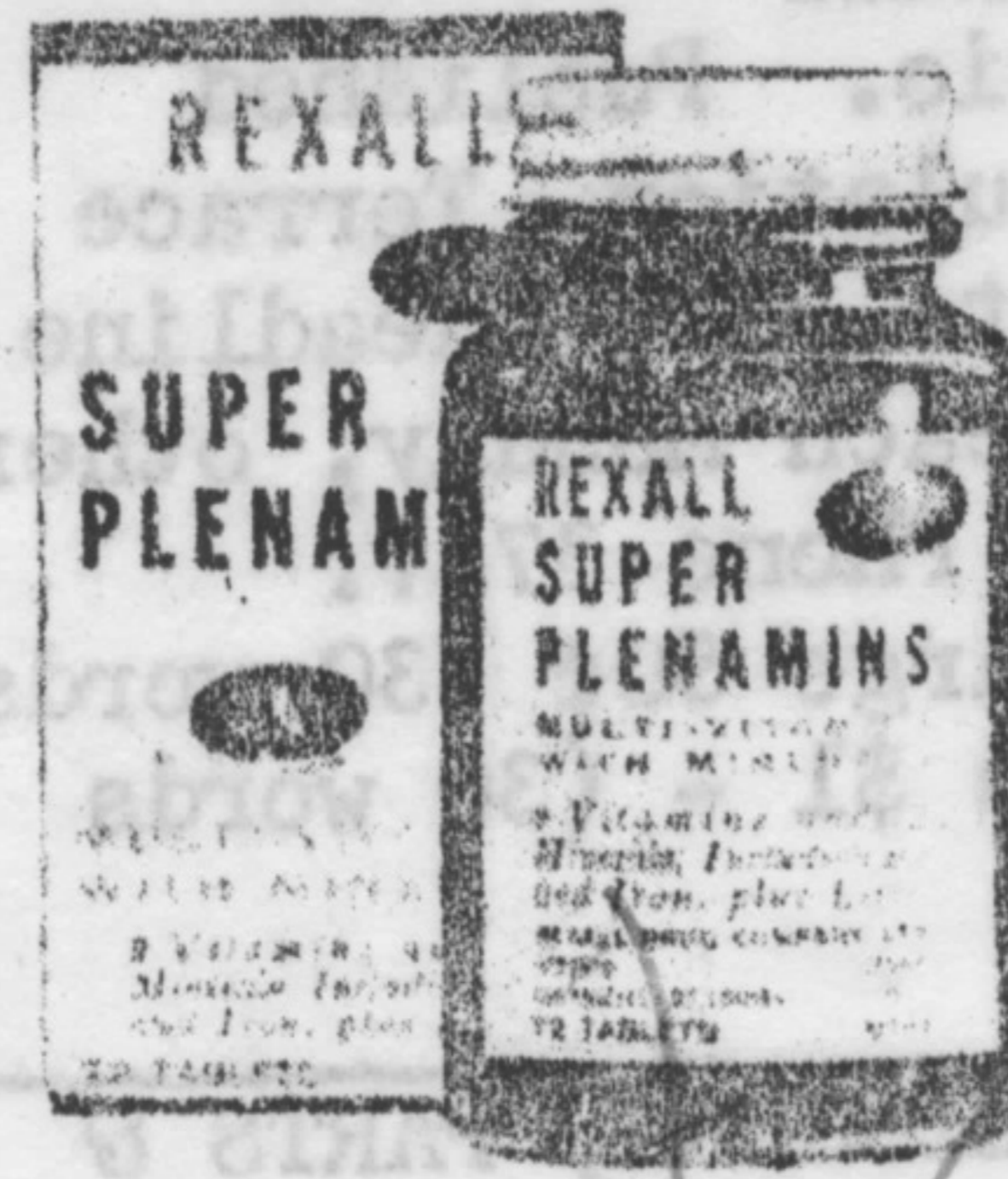
Freddie Willoughby has left for Caronport, Sask. where he has enrolled in Briercrest Bible Institute.
