SCHOOL SAFETY PATROLS FORMED

Everyone, by now, is probably aware of the white belted girls and boys standing at certain points on Highway 17 during school days. These boys and girls are a responsible group of school children interested in the promotion of safety to their fellow schoolmates. In their position as a School Safety Patrol member, they are responsible for the lives of others while crossing the highway to and from school. They stand at their positions in warm weather or cold weather, taking this responsibility in earnest. Their success in this position depends upon the cooperation of their fellow schoolmates, school boards and staffs, parents and adults of this community. Without the support of everyone, they cannot function satisfactorily, and their efforts will be to no avail.

The School Safety Patrols have been organized with the assistance of Mr. T.O. Poole, of the Department of Transport, the School Boards, Town Council, Kiwanis Club and the School Staffs, and is endorsed by the local Police Department.

A patrol team has been chosen from Grade 8 pupils of both the Separate School and Public School. Teams comprise of one Captain and eight patrol members, two of which are spares.

The Kiwanis Club of Terrace Bay has undertaken to equip the members of the patrols with belts and badges.

Crosswalk markings and school crossing signs will be erected at the crossings located at Kenogami Road, Simcoe Plaza and at the Hotel, in the near future.

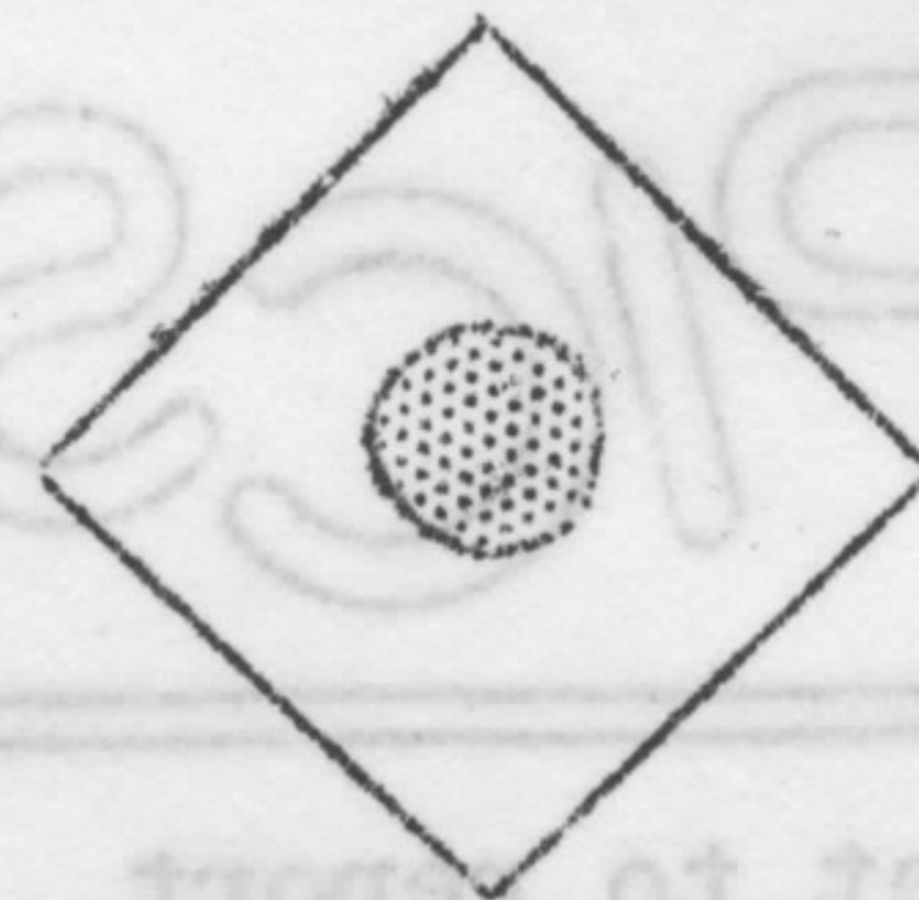
