Chief Constable H. Billings Folice report was read to Council stating criminal activities decreased during the month of September, other than for petty cases. All cases and activities were duly listed. Reeve Ferrier commended both the Fire and Police reports as being excellent, and he requested some members of Council attend each sitting of Magistrate's Court in Terrace Bay.

September accounts for Library, Hydro Electric and Township were perused and accepted for payment. An amendment to By-Law No. 141 was made to cover accurately this year's roads allowance. Report on the spreading of black mulch on Elizabeth, Princess, Lakeview. and Superior as completing all roads within the torn, as a very good job. Building permits for September were granted totalling \$62,755. Drawings of the proposed new 32 unit double decker Motel and Restaurant to be erected by Mr. Joe Adamo on his present property site were discussed and Council agreed to consider his application when presented next week together with his final architect's drawings. Mr. Duncan presented a request to have Chief Constable Billings attend a Training Course for Police Officers at Quetico from November 6 to 10, which was readily approved by Council.

COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve John Ferrier opened the regular meeting of Council Wednesday afternoon by granting an audition to Mr. Clarence Buck who sought a garage rather than a service station license for the new Texaco Station -The Circle Route Service. Council advised Mr. Buck to commence operations under the service station license and they would review his case when Mr. Pearen, his partner, could be present during their next regular meeting.

Business continued with the reading of minutes and correspondence by the Secretary Mr. W.F. Strutt. Correspondence included approval from the Hydro Electric Commission in Toronto for the Terrace Bay Hydro to make expenditures from local funds for the construction of the proposed Utilities Building valued at \$52,500., and for improvements to the electrical distribution within the town. A further letter from the Hydro Commission confirmed the acceptance by Council of the new town rates as 35 - 40 on and after January 1, 1962. A letter of commendation was sent to Mr. A. Hartman on the organizing of the new School Safety Patrols through the cooperation of a group of the town's citizens, the school staffs, students, Kiwanis Club and Town Constables, which now presented a more orderly and less hazardous line of student traffic.
