Schreiber Town Council attended to a number of divergent items at the October meeting, one of the most outstanding being a request by D. Caldwell to be permitted to establish a Trailer Camp. The matter is held in abeyance for further study.

The Chamber of Commerce thanked Council for their cooperation on various projects and suggested holding a meeting similar to the one held last year prior to the Municipal Election when candidates for the various offices were introduced to the voters.

A request for a lane on Walker Lake Road was termed impractical by the Department of Highways. A drainage problem on Galena St. is being investigated and a petition from residents of Ann Street discussed.

Glad Bros. received notification to remove existing gravel piles and consideration was given to licensing of tourist accommodation.

Ontario Hospital Insurance for a ward of the Town was obtained on advice of the Childrens Aid Society. The Society was advised by Council that they can no longer use the Chambers to hold meetings.

Acting on a supplementary by-law a request was sent to the Department of Highways for laying cold mulch on Main Street and some of its approaches.
