slab floor with Desert Brown Brick-Veneer exterior Walls. The Roof is a Low slope white Asphalt shingle with Copper Flashings and Eavestroughing. It measures 118 feet in length; with the Sanctuary Trancept being 60 feet wide; the width of the Nave being 43 ft. 10 inches. Its outside walls are of a Sawtooth Design with the Front Golden Buff Mosai (Stone) Panels completing this effect, along with its copper-finished serrated Canopy.

Inside walls in the Baptistry, Ushers Room, Sacristies, Crying-Room, Washrooms are Gold or Ivory painted plaster. The Nave walls are of Blonded White Birch playwood panelling and the ceiling is B.C.Spruce stained a light mahogany colour. The entire window area of the perimeter of the building is in coloured Cathedral glass in random pattern with a translucent Cross above the main entrance. The design assures that the sunshine will strike the Altar in the morning, afternoon and evening.

The Church is both electrically heated and lighted, the fixtures being of Gold Brass finish in modern church design. The solid Oak front doors have hammered iron hardware. All other doors are of birch, either varnished or blonded white and all hardware is of heavy stainless steel and aluminum construction.

To the right of the spacious entrance porch is the completely furnished Baptistry; to the left, the Ushers Room and Hallway leading to the Choir. Heavy Glass and wood doors open into the Church proper with its Red-Oak Pews; Vinyl asbestos tile in chocolate brown and dark ivory complement the rest of the decor. The Altar-railing, the side Altars the Pulpit and the Main Altar (with its glazed brick back-wall) are all uniquely constructed with White Limestone caps set on Toronto dark brown glazed brick pillars with ceramic white brick used in the Cross designs in the railing and Altar background. Tiling in the Sanctuary, corridors and Sacristies again carries out the brown and white motif.

The Church is built and furnished through the generosity of its Parishioners. The beautiful Dark-stained wooden cross above the main Altar with its natural wood Corpus Christi is hand carved by German craftsmen.

Originally proposed and pioneered by Very Rev. J.C.McHugh and Mr.Albert Gauthier, it is sad that neither lived to see the finished Church. Rev. Joseph M.Cano, Parish Priest, has played a very active roll in promoting
