

Whiskey affects your vision

Fifty men and women had eye examinations before driking - then they each drank 1 ounce of whiskey for every 30 pounds of body weight. That means a 150 pound person consumed five drinks in less than an hour.

Forty-five minutes after the drinks were consumed each person was retested and the results were as follows:

- 1. All suffered loss of visual sharpness.
 - 2. Thirty percent had a significant drop in depth perception.
 - 3. More than half were unable to judge distance well.
- 4. More than half were affected by glare. Drinking impaired judgment and reaction time the test showed. When quick thinking is vital to survival the drinking driver is handicapped.

W. D'ARCY RE-ELECTED

Schreiber citizens re-elected Wm. E.D'Arcy as Reeve for his eighth term. He polled 303 votes in a close race which showed runner-up W. J. Handel only ten votes behind with 293.

Joseph McGrath headed the vote for Councillor with 335. The other Councillor will be Mrs. Inez McCuaig who received 264 votes. Both have had previous municipal experience. Mr. McGrath having served for two years on Council and Mrs. McCuaig, the first woman to be elected to Council, has served one year.

Don Beno was runner-up with 258 votes -Mrs. Edna Cox polled 119 and D. D'Amour received 107 votes.

The percentage of voters exercising their franchise dropped this year when only 60% turned up at the Polls.
