LETTER TO THE EDITOR

It is unfortunate that the District High School question was kept from the general public for so long. I believe, that had the issue been let out some time ago, public opinion in both towns would have dictated the establishment of the District High School. The real issue has been pushed into the background and economics and some vague things described by some as civic pride, have been put to the fore.

Every rational person will agree that not all of the children in these towns is university material and therefore we should supply an alternative - bookeeping, shorthand, typewriting, crafts and so on. This is not to be. The teachers of a District High School could spend more time with the pupils since they would be teaching one specific subject, not two or three, which is the case at present. We could go on enumerating the advantages to our children but this of no advantage at this late date. This was the real issue, the ultimate welfare of the children of the area belonging to parents of moderate means who cannot afford the expense of sending all of their boys or girls away to be educated. It is unfortunate that some of the people who could have influenced the decision preferred to ignore the welfare of the large group affected.
