As a Schreiber ratepayer with three children on their way to High School education I feel, as many other parents feel, why should we be railroaded into higher taxes by the High School Board and members of Council, due to a stubborn pride. This is 1962 and the days of feuding are over or should be. Our High School Trustees and Council should think over the many advantages of a combined High School with Terrace Bay--both education wise, for the future of our children and tax-wise, for the future of our pockets. Many others besides myself feel the advantages to be gained are far superior to the building of our own High School.

Terrace has a sewer system and a very reliable water supply which are both far above the septic tanks in Town and the slow trickle of water from the toilet tanks and taps in our houses. The over all cost will be less as there will not be too many alterations necessary to Terrace Bay's High School and the split offered by Terrace Bay is a thought to think over seriously and should be taken into consideration.

In closing this letter I would like to challenge the School Board and Council to put this school matter to a public vote and let the majority rule. Remember we should all hide our stubborn pride and make the two towns as one for the betterment of our children's education. Taxpayer.
