SWEEP TICKETS ILLEGAL TO SELL

Several persons at the Lakehead for reasons unknown to themselves, have received in the mail books of sweepstake tickets with the apparent hope that they will peddle them here. These are not the well-known Irish tickets but are two completely new varieties on the local scene.

One type is called the Malta Government Lottery and they are returnable to Valletta Malta, for a race to be run March 25. The other is sponsored by the Jamaica Turf Club on a race in Jamaica March 24 for the Governor's Cup.

Authorities said today that it is illegal to sell these tickets or even to have them in possession and the penalty is severe. It is suggested that anyone receiving books of these tickets contact the local police immediately and hand them over.

GOV'T BANS "CARBON TET" EXTINGUISHERS

Carbon tetrachloride (vaporizing liquid) extinguishers are no longer approved government equipment. Approval was withdrawn Jan. 1.
