The suggestion of the Kenora Rainy T.B. Committee that a health educator be secured for North Western Ontario was unanimously endorsed by the East Thunder Bay Tuberculosis Assoc. - iation at their meeting in Schreiber on February 15th.

A bill for necessities for local Sanatorium patients was paid but it was emphasized the patient's requirements should be requisitioned from this committee through the Sanatorium.

Mrs. J. Ferrier presided over the meeting with Mrs. N. McCuaig reading minutes and a lengthy file of correspondence.

It was reported that all Terrace Bay School children have been given the tuberculin test.

Needles were sent on request to Terrace Bay, Beardmore, Geraldton, Hornepayne, and supplied to Schreiber.

The newly purchased Heaf Gun was used in Schreiber, Terrace Bay, and Marathon has requested it.

Holy Angel School, 234 tested, 3 positive,
Schreiber Public School - 4 positive,
Schreiber High School - 1 positive,
