HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL ADDRESSES WOMEN'S GROUP

O.B. Fasan High School Principal, was guest speaker at the Regular Meeting, of the United Church Women on February 21st.

He gave a closely-followed account of Educational Minister's Robart's new plan for High Schools. Starting in Grade 9, where their studies will be 80% Academic, and 20% in a selected channel, studens will have, on graduation from this class, three choices in following grades to Graduation. They may take an Academic Course presumably leading to Arts B.A., Commercial, or Technical.

Their subjects will be in keeping with the courses, and all of them will, on graduation give entrance to University. This is one plan. A second will give students, NOT interested in going on to University, the same three channels to choose from, but with the difference that they will be complete courses. Still a third plan is

designed for the students recognized to have neither the ability or desire for a higher education.

For them a course in skilled labor will be made available, in the craft of their choice.

H: Fasan explained the advantages which Schreiber will secure in its new High School and paid tribute to the School Board, who budget wisely and select carefully the staff for their school and follow closely the school year.

Teaching staffs too, feel that they must enter into closer ties with the town, in which they live, realizing that the closer relationship, will bring a better understanding of their students, and thereby more sucess for them in their work.

Mrs. R.C. Macadam, President, thanked Mr. Fasan.

Mrs. T.P. Whent, Unit Leader reported that routine work was advancing. Mrs. V. Weaver reported on a successful Valentine Tea, and Mrs. A. Gordon is convening a St. Patrick's Day Tea.
