COUNCIL QUOTES

A delegation from the Chamber of Commerce, Messrs. C.E. Paget and J. Caccamo met with the Terrace Bay Council prior to their regular meeting Wednesday, to strongly urge they expedite the development of a Trailer Park and Camp Site, and to offer their services in any manner to further this project.

Reeve Heenan replied for Council, stating they have negotiated with the Company, had the land surveyed and were at present, awaiting the clarification of their yearly commitment, under the Parks Assistance Act.

He doubted seriously, their ability to do much more than develop the swimming area, water and sewage, and to make a small start on the park facilities in 1962 with the balance completed in 1963 and 64. Questioned by the delegates as to the desirability of which should be given development priority, Reeve Meeman felt it benefited the majority

to see the swimming area completed though he did not close the door on the possibility of further development this year.

Before leaving Mr. Paget on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce, questioned the reasoning for refusal of the use of the Town Crest on Business establishment membership cards.
