The full council, with clerk-treasurer, attended the regular meeting on March 12, with F.V. Harness presiding until the arrival of Reeve D'Arcy.

The 1962 assessment roll of \$1,833,220.00 was adopted with the following estimates - general \$87,600.00, Schools \$94,726.85; Mill rates - general - residential 36.58, commercial 39.80, Public School - residential 24.05, commercial 26.72; Separate School - residential 24.05, commercial 26.72; High School - 26.90.

A by-law authorizing the borrowing of \$400,000.00 for the purchase of grounds and for the construction of the new Schreiber High School was given two readings and unanimous approval. (Continued on Page 9)
