

He also complimented the girls on their initiative in taking this course and seeing it through to completion, noting it would be invaluable to them for the rest of their lives. Chairman of the Schreiber-Terrace Bay Branch, Mr. Lester Crandlemire thanked both Mr. Farwell and Mr. Ferrier for their participation in the evening and added his congratulations to the girls.
