pool and were willing to pay for it. This would be a pay as you go plan. Those willing could affiliate for a dollar a month per family and those wishing to join for the summer only, could do so paying not less than Twelve Dollars. A transient rate would be established and seven day a week supervision provided.

Further suggestions for the Town Pool area were offered, which would receive the regular Town fogging. Councillor Evans-Smith urged some action be taken immediately as a pool should be established for the coming season. Councillors Fraser and Evans-Smith agreed to act with Reeve Heenan together with two representatives from the Recreation Committee and two other interested parties as a committee to investigate the pool. A public meeting will be called when sufficient information on costs, etc. have been confirmed.

Councillor Valiquette recommended Reeve Heenan and Secretary Strutt consider attending a Municipal Convention in June.
