COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve J. P. Heenan opened the meeting of Council last Wednesday, in the Terrace Bay Municipal Offices by calling upon the Secretary W. F. Strutt for the minutes and correspondence. Present were Councillors D. Evans-Smith, J. Wellings and A. Fraser, Clerk W. Hanly and Fire Chief R. Hofland.

Notice had been given that the present Municipal Offices would be vacated at the end of April. Permission was granted to the Girl Guide Association to hold their Annual Cookie Day, May 26th. A survey of costs on indoor and outdoor pools had been requested of the Ontario Municipal Association.

A letter from the Terrace Bay Chamber of Commerce contained many recommendations to improve parking facilities at the shopping centre during the tourist season, and invited representation at their next meeting, to consider the Hawkers and Peddlers By-Law. The items were discussed by Council with Reeve Heenan stating he would reply to this letter.

Fire report for the month of March showed no fire call out during that period, making a total of 53 days fire free. Acting Fire Chief Hofland requested permission to hold one extra practice a month for two months to familiarize the drivers with pump operations. This will be discussed at the forthcoming meeting of the Fire and Police Committee. Acting Fire Chief Hofland further reported the St. Johns Ambulance Classes were successfully concluded and Council would be requested to present certificates to the Volunteer Firemen on April 25. On this date, Mr. L. Cottenden of the Fire Marshall's Office would be present to award the N.F.P. Certificate of Merit.

Accounts for the Public Library, Hydro Electric and Township were read by the Secretary and passed for payment. A motion was passed to accept the new rates as set by Ontario Hydro Electric Commission.

The dogs - at - large situation was thoroughly reviewed and a Dogcatcher will be reinstated for the season.

A private enterprise has shown interest in the proposed Trailer Park, and Councillors reviewed the situation to date, though still awaiting approval from the Department of Lands and Forests.

By motion Acting Fire Chief R. Hofland became the Town Fire Chief. The By-Law on the sale of Fireworks was reviewed and would be enforced this year.

Councillor Fraser inquired about office space in the new fire hall, and was informed this would be brought up at the special meeting of the Police and Fire Committees next week.

A suggestion to order supplies for landscaping now was made by Councillor Evans-Smith and he enquired about the treatment of the passageway by the new Hydro Utilities Building.
