from Marathon, presented for discussion, a proposal to assess each member of the Sub-Chapter based on either membership or assets. Debating the value of each on a voluntary basis, a decision was reached to assess according to assets.

President of the Lakehead Chapter, Mr. Harry Miles, took the opportunity of speaking to members present on the recent Ontario Credit Union Convention held in Windsor and also one last week in Minnesota. Elaborating on the pitfalls as well as the necessity for big business, Mr. Miles outlined two proposals to erase their present indebtedness incurred in building, by either One Dollar per member contribution or voluntary contributions from the Credit Unions. Speaking on the Minnesota Convention he had found that while Ontario may have certain problems, the States had their own with Government legalities, such as the right to waive interest in the event of a member's illness. In closing, Mr. Miles invited attendance to the Lakehead Chapter's School on June 1st and 2nd.
