COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve J.P. Heenan presided last Wednesday over the first meeting of Town Council in the new Chambers in the Hydro Utilities Building. All Councillors were present, J. Wellings, D. Evans-Smith, A. Valiquette and A. Fraser with Secretary W. F. Strutt and Clerk Hanley.

7.00 P.M. - Bible Study

An audience was given Mr. Don Boudreau, Electrical Superintendent, as Councillors sought to clarify facts and figures concerning the proposed Voltage Changeover for the town. Having rapidly acquired the position of the largest per capita consumers in Ontario since the town came into existence some thirteen - fourteen years ago, the limitations had very nearly been reached on power and preparations must be made to expand either immediately or in the near future. It was pointed out, without the sub-station and its cost of maintenance, the changeover would be covered financially in six or seven years, in addition to providing increased power to the town. Reeve Heenan thanked Mr. Boudreau for his factual report.

Tenders for construction of the sewage lagoon were opened and perused with the successful and lowest bidder being Croydon

Construction of Fort William.

On a request from the Recreation Association Committee Council agreed to meet with that body to discuss areas of responsibility. Permission was granted the C.G.I.T. to hold their annual Carnation Sale on May 12th. A request had been received from Kimberly-Clark to vacate the old Fire Hall now being used as garage and storage for the Utilities truck. Reeve Heenan agreed to investigate any need of the building.

Mr. J. Ferrier advised council that unmetered power which had been provided in
the area known as the South Camp and now
the Industrial area, would be discontinued
this summer. The area would be revamped and
charges to the occupants would be on a

commercial basis.

Fire Chief, R. Hofland's April report was read listing two minor fires and advising of the transfer to their new location in the Utilities Building. A reply was received from Mr. W. Finlay, accepting Chairmanship of the Bush Fire Control Committee.

April accounts for the Public Library, Hydro Electric and Township were perused by Councillors and passed for payment.

A motion was passed to provide janitorial service for the Utilities Building and a further motion gave a revised schedule of duties and salaries for the Police Department. (Continued on Page 11)

TRANSIENT WELFARE COMMITTEE ANNUAL MEETING

Corporal Ford Richardson, OPP, presided for the annual meeting of the Welfare and Transient committee which met in the court room with six attending.

A thorough discussion followed the financial report and it was unanimously agreed to continue the program which was instigated in 1954 by Corporal Richardson, Rev. J. Turner and the late Dean J.C. McHugh.

The fund was established to do away with the need for door to door begging by unfortunates and has been most successful in this purpose. The cases are screened by this committee and the fund administered by the OPP local detachment. Gas has been provided for those stranded in cars, railway fares, for others, and many meals.

Most gratifing to the committee are the deeply appreciative letters received from those in desperate circumstances who have

been assisted.

The committee is grateful to the Terrace Bay council and Legion for their donations toward the fund.

The local plan for dealing with the problem has evoked many inquiries from other communities who have heard of its success and wish to start a similar one.

Donations are welcomed from any organization or private citizen and may be directed

to Corporal Richardson.
