insufficient members to constitute a general meeting of the Terrace Bay Chamber of Commerce, President C.E. Paget declared the meeting on May 22nd, a meeting of the Council since the required number of the council were present. Minutes of the May 2 Council meeting were read by the Secretary J. Kelty.

The President read a letter received from Constable H. Billings outlining the result of his investigation into cost and features of a burglar alarm system for local merchants. This matter was turned over to J. Adamo for further investigation with the understanding that he will report back to Council.

A report on the current status of the Aguasabon Gorge prepared by Norm Kelly was reviewed and filed.

Question presented by members of the Chamber of Commerce, concerning the annual spring clean up were generally discussed and Mr. Paget agreed to contact the Township Council offering to make a tour of the community and submit a report on the need for a general clean up if indicated. Should the Township Council agree to this suggestion, it was felt that the emphasis should be on property adjacent to the highway and the business district. Mr. Kelty volunteered to head up this project if and when clearance is received.

J. Adamo was appointed to head up a committee to investigate the parking problem in and

around the business district.

It was agreed that installation of two or three mail drop boxes in the Town would be of benefit to citizens. W. Colborne was appointed to investigate the matter and prepare a letter to the Post Office Department, making such a request.

On question from a Chamber member, the President advised that any and all members

are welcome at Council meetings.
