DELEGATES REPORT TO CATHOLIC WOMEN'S LEAGUE

The last meeting of the Catholic Women's League, before their summer recess was held Sunday evening, June 10 in the Parish Hall of St. Martin's Church. Very Rev. Dean E.A. Gallagher opened the meeting with Prayers and Mrs. G. Dashkewytch presided.

Minutes of the last meeting were read by Mrs. G. Savoy and financial report given by Mrs. J. Ruzyski. Members of the various committees were then asked for their reports.

Mrs. Dashkewytch gave an interesting account of the Diocesan Convention which she and Mrs. F.A. Helmink attended in Dryden on May 15 and 16. Of particular interest is the project, Operation Eskimo. This is a Social Action which endeavours to give some help to needy Eskimo families at Christmas time. Parish Councils of Ontario and Manitoba are responsible for the drive this year. If Parish mem-

bers wish to donate any used clothing for adults or children - new or used toys, vacuum packed foods, tobacco etc., they may contact the Citizenship Convenor Mrs. F. Vienneau. This must be in by July 1st as the deadline for mailing is August 15. These are sent to the Oblate Fathers, Cambridge Bay Mission, Northwest Territories.

The following are two other highlights of the Convention which the President mentioned particularly. Sister Mary, Principal of St. Patrick's Highschool, Fort William, attended the Canadian Conference of Education in Montreal in March. Her report will be read to members by the Education Convenor, Mrs. J. St. Louis at the meetings from time to time throughout the year. Mrs. Dashkewytch was especially enthusiastic with an address given by Mrs. G. Gamble, Separate School principal in Dryden, the subject of which was the Parent, Child, Teacher and Education. A copy of this will be read to the members at a meeting in the Fall.

Dean Gallagher spoke briefly to members and the meeting closed with Prayers, Father's Blessing and the singing of "Holy God We Praise Thy Name" and "O Canada". A delicious luncheon was served at the close of the evening by Mary Chesley and her committee.
