BOARD OF HEALTH REPORT

The Board of Health held its first meeting of the year on June 19 with Reeve W.E. D'Arcy as Chairman. Dr. Cornell, M.O.H., Mrs. W.G. Furlonger, ratepayers' representative, Edward Borutski, inspector and R.C. Skinner, secretary attended.

Dr. Cornell stated that the YMCA kitchen and lavatory facilities in the Town Hall and Public Library, earlier inspected and found unfit had, after alterations, been accepted as satisfactory. One clubhouse cesspool is still unsatisfactory. A report is also being considered on cabins at Walker Lake and premises within the town.
