### THE FUTURE (Continued from Page 1)

The United Kingdom also imports about \$30 million of pulp from Canada each year. Newsprint and pulp is admitted free of duty but the European Economic Community has chosen a common external tariff of seven per cent for newsprint and six per cent for pulp, with provision for tariff-free quotas in special circumstances. If the United Kingdom were to join the European Economic Community and were to accept the present external tariff without special provisions for the Commonwealth, Canada's position in relation to other competitive suppliers in the United Kingdom might not be worsened. Imports from all sources, previously admitted free, would be subject to tariffs but the rates would be the same for Canada as for all others. Domestic newsprint manufacturers, however, would have slight competitive advantage which they do not possess at the present time, since the pulp tariff would be one percentage point less than that on newsprint. If Scandinavian countries become associated with the Common Market, Canada would be at a disadvantage.
