HORT. SOCIETY MEETING, MONDAY AUGUST 20

With the 8th Annual Horticultural Show scheduled for Saturday, August 25th it was felt advisable to hold a general meeting when members could have an open discussion on entering their exhibits.

Many worthwhile plants and vegetables have been disqualified by a judge in the past for such reasons as entering more of an item than specified on the entry list.

Come out Monday evening, August 20th at 8 P.M. to the large meeting room of the Recreation Centre and discuss your exhibits.

OPEN SEASON FOR BLACK BEARS --(DEPT. OF LANDS AND FORESTS)

Toronto - The Minister of Lands and Forests has announced that, following the expiry of the open season on black bears which ended on June 30th, a new open season on this game species will commence on September 1, 1962 and close on June 29, 1963.

During the autumn period the black bear may be hunted by residents who are holders of licenses to hunt deer or moose in Ontario and by non-residents who hold any of the non-resident licenses valid for hunting in Ontario. During the spring period both residents and non-residents of the Province must be holders of special licenses which apply to the spring season.

OPEN SEASON FOR GAME BIRDS

Toronto - The Hon. J.W. Spooner, Minister of Lands and Forests, has announced open seasons for the hunting of game birds, including Ruffed Spruce, and Sharptailed Grouse, Ptarmigan,

Hungarian Partridge, and Pheasants in Ontario.

The seasons announced by Mr. Spooner are similar in many respects to those held in 1961, except that there has been some modification of the boundaries between areas with different seasons, and there has been some liberalization of seasons where biological information has indicated that extensions are justified.

The Ruffed, Spruce and Sharptailed Grouse and Ptarmigan season opens on September 15th throughout most of this area.

The bag limits will allow the taking of 5 Ruffed or spruce grouse in the aggregate per day and the possession of 15 in aggregate; 5 sharptails per day with a possession limit of 15; and 5 ptarmigan per day with a possession limit of 15.

The longer season in most of Ontario recognizes the minute effect that the length of season during the fall of the year has on grouse populations in general.

The Partridge Season will open on September 22nd and close on November 24th. The partridge season was not extended to December 15th to coincide with other grouse seasons, since this species often congregates along roadsides after the first snow cover and becomes extremely vulnerable to hunters.

The daily bag of 8 per day and possession limit of 16 is the same as last year.

OPEN SEASON FOR FOX

Fox may be trapped, hunted or possessed in any part of Ontario from the 1st day of September, 1962 to the 31st day of August, 1963 both inclusive, (Continued on Page 6)
