

HUNTING (Continued from Page 4) except specified restricted areas in Southern Ontario.

OPEN SEASON FOR RACCOON

Raccoon may be trapped, hunted or possessed in any part of Ontario from the 1st day of September, 1962 to the 31st day of August, 1963, both inclusive.

OPEN SEASON FOR SQUIRREL

Black, grey and fox squirrel may be trapped, hunted or possessed. No person shall hunt more than an aggregate number of ten squirrels in a day, or possess more than an aggregate number of ten squirrels at one time.

Toronto - The Minister of Lands and Forests, the Hon. J.W. Spooner has announced the signing and award of a contract for twenty-eight thousand square miles of aerial photography to Hunting Survey Corporation of Canada Limited. The contract was awarded following a public call for tenders to do this work.

The area to be photographed is in the Geraldton and Port Arthur Administrative Districts. More generally, the area lies north of Lake Superior east of a line extending north through White River, westerly to the west shores of Lake Nipigon.

The rephotography is carried out as a part of the province-wide reinventory of forest resources. The photographs, printed from film taken at an altitude of approximately eight thousand feet, are closely examined to determine the extent of changes which have taken place since the previous photography and inventory.

This part of Ontario was last photographed in 1947-48. Thus the prints will reveal many changes - new roads and highways, townsites, mines, transmission lines, and flooded area. The base maps will be revised to record these changes and thus permit the updating of the

topographic maps, which are widely circulated for a variety of uses.

The detailed study of the photographs also permits an opportunity to record changes in forest. The effects of insect, disease, fire, cutting and wind, all become apparent to the skilled interpreter, and subsequently are recorded on forestry maps. The extent to which previously denuded areas are regenerating can also be detected. These data permit an updating of forest inventory records, and thereby afford an opportunity to maintain a proper balance between forest depletion and replacement.

This is the fifth year of rephotography under the Department's ten-year programme, scheduled for completion in 1967.
