W.H. PALMER APPOINTED ASST. DEPUTY MINISTER

Appointment of William H. Palmer, 46, as assistant deputy minister, municipal administration, has been announced by municipal affairs minister Fred M. Cass.

Mr. Palmer, who started in government service in 1945 with the Registrar-General's branch, has been director of special projects since 1958. In this capacity he was responsible for the affairs of unorganized territories and areas under government supervision.

An R.C.A.F. veteran with four years overseas service, Mr. Palmer became accountant for the department in 1947. In 1951 he was appointed supervisor, municipal administration, and in 1956 became executive officer of the Department.

The following is the C.P.& T. Committee report up to the end of June, 1962.

The committee have been active in raising funds to carry out their humanitarian work and by such efforts have been able to render assistance to all cases brought to their attention, wherever such assistance was necessary.

As of June 30th the sum of \$756 had been raised: \$344.00 went to assist in medical expenses on cases reported. For gifts at Christmas and for those in hospitals and also to shut-ins \$85.00 was spent. Expenses for prizes etc. amounted to \$75.00.

The Committee wish to thank those who donated gifts of monies to the C.P.& T. Fund and also to those who contributed articles to be used for medical purposes and to everyone who patronized their fund-raising project.

The Committee have on hand one hospital bed and mattress, wheel chairs, crutches, etc. which are available to any person who wishes to use them. Just apply to Mrs. B. Whent, Secretary of the C.P.& T. Committee. There is no charge for the use of any C.P.& T. equipment.
