COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Township Council met in the Municipal Office on Wednesday, September 12th with Reeve J.P. Heenan presiding and Councillors, D. Evans-Smith, A. Fraser, J. Wellings, Clerk-Treasurer, W.F. Strutt and Assistant, W. Hanley present.

The minutes of the last meeting, as presented by Clerk Treasurer W.F. Strutt, were approved.

Correspondence included a letter from F.O. Soughton regarding construction of a Tourist Shopping Centre north of the Norwood Motel on Simcoe Plaza, and Consideration was given to his proposals and decisions on same reached. The Police and Fire Reports, proposed by Chief H. Billings and R. Hofland were noted and permission granted to the Fire Chief to purchase Banners etc. for Fire Prevention week. Expenses covering attendance at Gravenhurst Fire School for J. Mikus and E. Persson were approved. Reeve Heenan had replied in the negative to a letter from the Department of Lands and Forests re-renting homes in Terrace Bay.

A Hydro Commission communication outlined the new "home heating" rates.

Council appointed Mrs. John Graham to act on the Recreation Committee, replacing Mrs. G. Black who had resigned.

A letter from the Recreation Committee will receive further consideration at the next meeting.

Library, Hydro, Township and Recreation accounts totalling approximately \$176,000 were approved for payment.

Dy-Law 148 was repealed and Dy-Law 148A adopted setting a new corrected tax rate.

Council authorized Wills Nursery to proceed with land scaping in front of the Utilities Building.

Reeve W.E. D'Arcy and the full Council attended the regular September meeting of the Municipal Council;- Clerk Skinner away on his vacation.

Mr. Harness stated the Glad Bros. had agreed to the trade proposition offered by the Council and the garage will be transferred to town property as soon as arrangements can be made.

It was decided to hold the old ambulance for the time being.

Weather has still prevented the gravel wall being built at the nuisance ground - dry weather the essential requirement in the project.

The restaurant license for Nick Comisso was withheld pending further study.

P.T. Hake offered water frontage lots at Walker Lake for sale and this was tabled for further consideration.

Further inquiry will be made from Spartan Air Service re photographic map of the town.

A definite date will be set for the representative of the engineering firm which is to change the subway to meet with Council.

Tenders for supplying oil for the year for the Fire Hall will be asked.

Glad Bros. protest re water installation was filed.

The Roman Catholic building committee requested that an adjacent culvert be lengthened. Councillors Harness and McCuaig had an amiable difference of opinion over solution of a drainage problem.

Complaints about garbage not being picked up were discussed and it was agreed citizens should be aware, after recent warnings, that collectors are not compelled to remove garbage unless it is in proper garbage containers.

The hall was booked for a public social on September 29th.
