COUNCIL QUOTES

A short meeting of Council was presided over by Reeve J.P. Heenan Wednesday afternoon in the Municipal offices to conclude the business of the month. Attending were Councillors Evans-Smith, Valiquette and Fraser, with Secretary W.F. Strutt and Clerk W. Hanley.

Following acceptance of past minutes the Secretary Mr. Strutt read all correspondence. Upon receipt of price lists, Council ordered Lapel pins for awards.

A letter from the Police Department with reference to the animal disposal act, requested consideration be given for an animal disposal area. The matter would be referred to Councillor Welling upon his return. Chief Constable Billings requested for permission to attend the meeting at Sault Ste. Marie October 2nd and 3rd of the Chief Constables, met with the approval of Council.

A letter from the Ontario Water Resources voiced approval of the completion of the Plant waste stabilization. With Civil Aeronautic routes of the North-South Air Service in the States being investigated, the Northwestern Ontario Development Association suggested a letter of support for this service be sent from each Town.

Reeve Heenan discussed the new electric rates for home-heating and hot water heating rates in these homes. This subject was left for more formal presentation at the forthcoming meeting. Councillor Fraser felt tenders should be sought to install the cement curbing at the Cemetery if it was going to be done this year.

Councillor Valiquette recommended a letter of appreciation and gift should be forwarded to Corporal Richardson prior to his retirement from the Ontario Provincial Police. Corporal Richardson has rendered invaluable assistance and continued co-operation from the neighboring Detachment.

Council discussed at length the progress being made at the swimming pool. Underground piping had been completed and bids for the change house were thoroughly perused. Councillor Evans-Smith noted the Kiwanis Club had bought the necessary fencing. A meeting of the Pool Committee was to be held shortly when recommendations on bids would be made.

Landscaping of the grounds in front of the Utilities Building is to be completed by the end of September.
