MEMORIAL SERVICE CONDUCTED

A Memorial Service was conducted in the Terrace Bay Community Church Friday afternoon at three, by the Rev. T. Garnet Husser for Donald Stewart Chittick, killed last Tuesday in an auto accident. Attending were the Students, Staff and School Board of the Terrace Bay Highschool and with the H. Lohr and G. Coom families representing the mourners.

The Choir led in the singing of Jesus Savior Pilot Me after the call to Worship. Rev. Husser in his sermon noted that though a relative newcomer to the community Donald Chittick had a capacity for warm friendship, winning a very real and lasting place in the hearts of his students and also his friends in the community.

In his sermon theme "Continuation of Life," Rev. Husser said that science has proven with experiment that energy can never be destroyed. It can only be changed. The highest energy known to man is the energy of the human personality which is a part of the energy that cometh directly from God Himself. No one can destroy this energy or take it from us. It can be changed and with the change, as with atomic energy, there comes released power. For the Christian this is what happens in the experience called death. The atomic structure of the body is changed and the personality is released to enter into a new form, a new condition, with new power in eternal life. Therefore Mr. Husser urged the young people to use this source of personality power that has been given to them, to find the place that God has made ready for them in this life, to spend time in preparation through schooling and self-discipline that this personality power may be developed and then use it with the help of God to the fullest advantage of humanity here.

Concluding the sermon, the congregation joined with the choir in singing Jesus Calls Us O'er the Tumult.

Mr. H. Lohr accompanied the body to Toronto, where the funeral was held on Saturday afternoon.
