The first Protestant Service was conducted in Terrace Bay by the Reverend Arthur Lavender on Sunday afternoon, November 10th, 1946 in the Pool Room with Mr. F.O. Soughton as organist.

The first official Board was elected by the newly formed congregation on May 11, 1947.

The present church was built and dedicated on December 9th, 1951. The mortgage was burned on July 31st, 1955.

Last Thursday Terrace Bay Schools took part in a series of surprise fire drill conducted by Fire Chief R. Hofland.

Grade four in St. Martin's Separate School were recipients of the Kiwanis Plaque. Mrs. Y. Rajotte accepted the presentation from Mr. Des Evans-Smith. In the Public School, the Grade Five students, with Mrs. T.G. Husser, teacher, received the Women's Institute Award, again presented by Mr. Evans-Smith.

The three-hundred and eleven pupils of the Public School cleared the Building in forty-eight seconds. The two hundred and sixty-eight pupils in St. Martin's School did it in thirty-eight seconds and the one hundred odd students in the High School got out in twenty-nine seconds.
