SCHREIBER COUNCIL
 Reeve D'Arcy, the full council and Clerk-Treasurer Skinner attended the October meeting of the Municipal council.

Reeve D'Arcy admonished council on the necessity of remaining within the budget in expenditures.

Councillors McCuaig and McGrath had a spirited exchange over the need for repairs and re-decoration of the library as opposed to renovation of other premises in the Town Hall. The public library, Mrs. McCuaig maintained is the one place in the Town which is visited by strangers regularly and should not therefore be left in the state of neglect it now is, since rental is paid.

The new agreement with the OPP for the policing of the town was passed.

Formal approval from the Ontario Municipal Board for the capital expenditure on the High School was read.

Notice was received from the city of Fort William that a former resident of Schreiber was now on relief there and, from the C.A.S. that two children had now been taken into their care for four month period.

A wreath was ordered from the Canadian Legion for the Remembrance Day service.

Councillor Guina urged that thought should start now for Schreiber's part in Canada's Centennial celebration.

Mrs. McCuaig suggested that this would be an auspicious time to hold a Schreiber re-union with attendant program and festivities.

The date for the court of revision was set for November 8th at 2 P.M. in the Town Hall Auditorium.

Mr. J. Worrell of the Dept. of Municipal Affairs, Assessment Division, will be asked to confer with Council at this time.

Councillor Harness reported many complaints regarding disturbance at night by barking dogs. In another area of the town residents were indignant over truck motors being revved at high speeds during sleeping hours at night.

Mr. Guina suggested that trash containers be placed at strategic spots in town and prices and information on these will be sought.

Residents on Ontario and Ann Streets who have placed refuse on the street or lane must remove such piles. Spadoni Co. were advised that the lane blocked by them must be cleared for use of residents. Bell Telephone were advised of a guy wire obstructing use of lane.

Price will be asked for supply of fuel oil for winter heating of the fire hall.

Mrs. McCuaig was requested to prepare a brief history of the town for display.

V.R. Shilhan were invited to demonstrate a portable rock drill and breaker.

Corp. Duncan was invited to discuss with council policing of the town. The treasurer suggested that water be reviewed and 1963 rates set. A meeting will be arranged with a representative of Wardrope and Associates in connection with the town water system.

Repair parts were ordered for the sump pump and Mr. McGrath and Mr. Harness delegated to take care of necessary repairs to the thawing machine.

The meeting convened at 8 P.M. and was adjourned at 12:05 A.M.

The Water Resources Corn. advised that application be made for approval of the proposed pumping system to the existing area, since it will be completed on current expenses.


