SCHOOL PATROL FOR KINDERGARTEN TOTS-PROBLEM
 Prior to the regular Public School Board meeting on Tuesday October 30th, the members of the Board were invited for tea and refreshments by the members of the teaching staff, and at this time were formally introduced to the teachers. After a very enjoyable get-together Mr. A. Pattison, thanked the teachers on behalf of the Board, and expressed his good wishes during this term.

Chairman A. Pattison chaired the regular monthly Board meeting. Mr. W.F. Colborne, Principal, submitted his report for the month of October. He advised the Board that the new black-out curtains have been installed in four rooms and have been a very practical item for the showing of filmstrips. A request for shelving in the school and the purchase of a sound projector will be investigated by the Board. Mr. Colborne reported the general operation and maintenance of the school is quite satisfactory.

The problem of supplying school patrol for the kindergarten children, who leave school one-half hour before the older students, was discussed at some length. Mr. J. Beddard will confer with the Separate School Board to try and arrive at some solution to this problem.
