

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Schreiber and Terrace Bay garage and service station operators held a meeting in Schreiber on November 6, 1962, to finalize plans for the formation of an association to be called "SCHREIBER AND TERRACE BAY GARAGE ASSOCIATION".

The main purpose for forming the association was to jointly control customer credit, in line with the bank's present day tight money policy due to the government's austerity programme.

In order to establish this credit control it was agreed upon that:

1. All association members will go on a monthly credit basis, and request that accounts be paid by the 10th of the month following date of purchase.
2. The association members will be notified of any defaulted accounts.
3. All accounts 90 days overdue will be turned over to a collection agency.
4. 1% interest per month will be added to all overdue accounts.

The above procedure will be in effect December 1, 1962, and will be followed by all members of the association when necessary. However, this additional cost and unpleasantness to all concerned can be avoided by payment of accounts when due. In adopting this policy the association hopes to avoid having to operate on a cash basis. Your co-operation would be appreciated.
