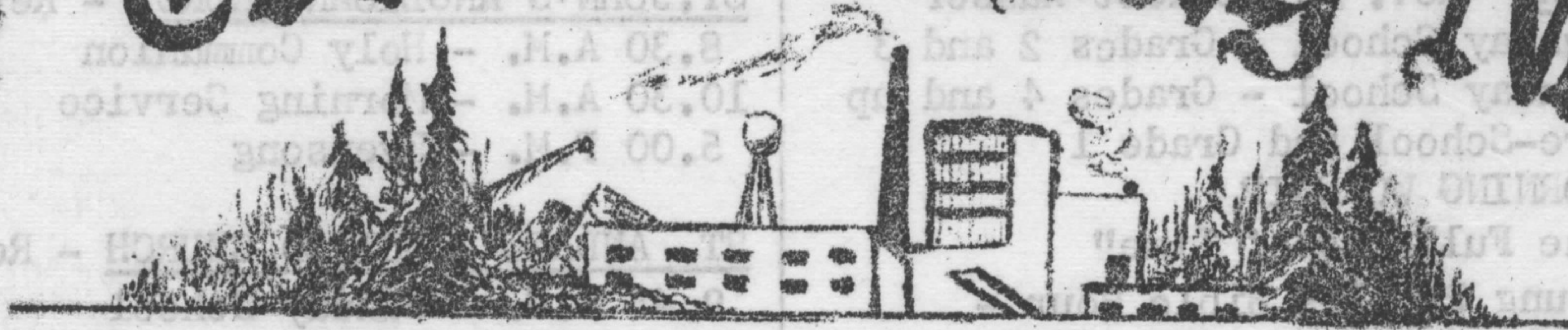

J. P. HEENAN, REEVE BY ACCLAMATION

A fair amount of interest was shown in Municipal affairs on Monday night and six names were listed as nominees for Council. They are W.J. Adamo, M.D. Campbell, A. Fraser, P. Romaniuk, A. Valiquette and J.E. Wellings. A surprise to many was the failure of D. Evans Smith to seek re-election. J.P. Heenan was the only nominee for Reeve and automatically assumes the post by acclamation.

Little interest was demonstrated in the School Board nominating meeting on Friday night when electors were scheduled to choose one member. J. Shivas was returned to the Board by acclamation leaving the slate unchanged. Other members are A. Pattison and J. Bedard.

Since all six Council nominees qualified in time there will be an election on December 3rd between the hours of 9 A.M. and 7 P.M. when electors must choose four men to represent them. The Polling Booth this year will be in the "Games or Teen Room" of the Recreation Centre.

TOWN HALL MEETING

The Terrace Bay Chamber of Commerce will again sponsor a "Candidates Night" this year. To be held in the High School Auditorium at 8:00 P.M. on Thursday, November 29th, the meeting will give Municipal candidates an opportunity to state their views and electors will have the chance to ask questions.
