 * SO DON'T CHANCE FIRE AT CHRISTMAS

* Communities such as ours in ontario suffer their biggest FIRE LOSS during
 * the winter season. The reason? All heating systems are in constant use and - CHRISTMAS
 * brings a flock new fire hazards into every home.

* The symbol of CHRISTMAS festivities, the CHRISTMAS tree, can turn from a
 * glittering family delight to a dangerous inferno if we are carless of FIRE SAFETY RULES
 * This hazard grows with the size of the tree, the length of time it has been cut, where
 * it is placed in the room and how long we keep it after CHRISTMAS.

* A few simple rules the householder can observe for CHRISTMAS tree FIRE safety
 * are :- "Always select a fresh cut tree, that is not dropping needles" keep it in a cool
 * place till it is put up. Then, cut off the trunk about an inch and a half from the
 * bottom at an angle and place the tree in water. Be sure to keep water in this container
 * at all times. Inspect all electrical lights, for breaks, frayed cords, or shorts if
 * any of these are found replace with new lights. Always purchase C.S.A. approved as
 * these are your assurance that they are fire and shock free. Choose the location in
 * the room carefully, away from all sources of heat, registers, T.V. sets, radiators or
 * open fire places. Make sure that if the tree falls it will not block an EXIT.
 * Never leave the lights on when you go to bed or out of the house for an evening or if
 * the children are left alone. Remember you do not have to be present for a fire to
 * start. CHRISTMAS parties, New Years parties increase the hazard of fires when smoking
 * around the tree not by yourself but others can also cause fires. Wrappings should also
 * be disposed of after the presents have been opened on CHRISTMAS morning.

* With these few tips your FIRE DEPARTMENT hopes that each and every householder
 * in TERRACE BAY will have a VERY MERRY CHRISTMAS and a PROSPEROUS NEW YEAR as well
 * as a FIRE FREE YEAR to come.
